The small but interesting shopping centre houses a number of eating establishments, an eclectic range of shops, such as 'Bundanoon Botanicals' - stocks a wide range of hand-made soaps, natural skin care products, fragrances, bath salts, essential oils, lip balm, foot soaks, furniture polish, soy wax scented candles and much more; 'The Good Yarn' stocks a lovely range of hand-knitted baby and children's clothes, home-made craft items, local honey, jams, chutneys and other treasures; 'Bundanoon Loves Dogs' - stocks a great range of dog toys, dog collars, leads, coats, beds, treats and much more! You're sure to enjoy just strolling and browsing in this pretty little town! Prior to departing from Bundanoon, why not pop across the railway line for a drink at the famous Bundanoon Hotel. Built in 1922, the Hotel is known for its old-world character and friendly country hospitality. You'll depart from Bundanoon at around 3.00pm to head straight to the Mercure Hotel, in Goulburn. This 4.5-star rated Hotel is located behind the 'Big Merino' - one of Goulburn's premier tourist attractions. Recently refurbished, the Hotel is regarded as the premier hotel in the NSW Southern Tablelands. The Hotel features over 70 well-appointed rooms - all with walk-in showers, free Wi-Fi, and tea & coffee-making facilities. You'll arrive at the Hotel at around 4.00pm. Be sure to visit the 'Young & Hilltops Visitor Information Centre', that stocks not only an interesting range of tourist information about the area, but also a wide variety of cherry products such as cherry jam, cherry cordial, cherry sauce, chocolate coated cherries, as well as many other local products, such as wine, pickles, honey, natural wax products, natural beauty products, and berry products such as jams and sauces. Also, during your stroll through the town, be sure to visit 'Poppa's Fudge & Jam Factory'. This amazing shop stocks a huge range of jams, chutneys, sauces, chocolates, lollies, and around 40 varieties of fudge - all made on the premises. The shop also stocks a large range of home décor and giftware items. During your visit to the town, today, you'll be able to take in the atmosphere and excitement of the town's annual 'National Cherry Festival'. Held during the weekend of the first Sunday in December each year, the Festival attracts thousands of visitors from elsewhere in New South Wales and Australia. There will be over 100 market stalls in attendance, as well as an all-day entertainment program on the main stage, featuring a range of singers and performers. You'll have around 3½ hours to explore the town centre, enjoy lunch in one of the town's many eating venues, and experience the annual Cherry Festival. You'll depart from Young at around 3.00pm, to head to the nearby Valley Fresh Cherries and Stonefruits. This family owned and operated orchard and Farm Gate sells a range of locally produced items, such as freshly picked cherries and strawberries, cherry pies, jams, sauces, chutneys, honey, and much more! You'll have around 40 minutes to visit the Farm Shop, prior to reboarding the coach at around 3.55pm to head to the Yass Soldier's Club. After making your way into the Club's Bistro, you'll sit down to a Full Choice of the Menu Dinner. After enjoying your Dinner, you'll reboard the coach at around 6.45pm, to return to the Mercure Hotel in Goulburn - arriving at around 7.45pm.

The collection contains unique objects, including the largest collection of Victoria Crosses in the world, a Lancaster bomber, and a number of outstanding dioramas dating from the 1920s. The National Portrait Gallery and/or The National Art Gallery of Australia - The National Portrait Gallery is home to the most extensive collection of portraits in the world. It features portraits of artists, musicians, entertainers, politicians, athletes, scientists, community leaders and more! During your visit to this award-winning building, you'll gain a greater understanding of Australia's identity, history, creativity, culture and diversity. <u>The National Art Gallery of Australia</u> is a great place for art enthusiasts and tourists who are interested in exploring the rich history of Australian and international art. It houses over 155,000 works of art, including the world's largest collection of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander art. One of the most notable works in its collection is the mural 'Blue Poles', painted by the American artist, Jackson Pollock, in 1952. Please Note: If you decide to visit The National Portrait Gallery, you'll also be able to visit The National Art Gallery, as they are located opposite each other. The Museum of Australian Democracy at Old Parliament House - Old Parliament House was the seat of Parliament in Australia between 1927 and 1988. In 2009 the building reopened as the Museum of Australian Democracy. During your visit you'll get to visit the House of Representatives Chamber, the Prime Minister's Suite, the building's grand halls and offices, and hear the echoes of the people, parties and prime ministers that shaped Australia's history. Parliament House - This stunning building was opened by Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II on the 9th of May 1988. It is the place where all federal laws are made that impact on our everyday lives. During your visit you'll have time to go on a free 25-minute guided tour of the building, which includes a visit to one of the chambers. For the balance of your time at the venue, you'll be able explore the many areas that are open to the public.
